Dear Mr. Snyder:

The following deficiencies have been brought to my attention by the Greenville Town Board:

- 1. The 3/4 inch service line to the Bannet's residence on Buck Creek Road is exposed where it crosses Buck Creek. This section of line will have to be reinstalled by blasting a trench across the creek, and encasing the line in concrete.
- The area around the repaired 12 inch line on Mr. Craig's property must be graded, strawed and seeded.
- The area around the repaired 3/4 inch service line on Mr. Lenfert's property must be graded, strawed and seeded.
- 4. Remit a check in the amount of three hundred seventy three dollars (\$373.00) to the Town of Greenville for water lost from the leak in Mr. Lenfert's service line.
- 5. The area just east of the tank site must be cleared of all brush stockpiled after the transmission main was installed.
- 6. All Apex--metal-impregnated plastic valve boxes and covers must be suited with cast iron rings and lids, as detection of the plastic is impossible.

- 7. The broken valve box at the Greenville Standpipe must be replaced with a cast iron box and cover.
- 8. The area around the fire hydrant on the property of Public Service Indiana just be graded, seeded and strawed.

I strongly urge you to address these items promptly or other actions will be taken.
