

Town Board Meeting June 13, 1989

Board members present were Pres. Ron Lamb, Bob Williams & H.L. Spears. Others attending were Paul Bucke, Bob Ingrigg, Harry Smith, Ray Bush, Darrell Kepley, and Gary Oetost.

Paul Bucke presented to the Town Board a monthly activity sheet performed by the Greenville Police Dept. Paul also attended a crime prevention and investigation schooling at Indianapolis and was certified. Mr. Bucke reported he has called six property owners in the town on the ordinance of high weeds this month. All but one have complied. No names were available.

Darrell Kepley told the Board that he has advertised his intentions to be annexed into the Town of Greenville. No decision was made, as proper procedure was unknown.

Harry Smith asked about the progress of the possibility of line extension to the people located on Hamby Road. Water Utility Engineer Bob Ingrigg reported that he had sent one of his men to meet with Scott Horn (Water Utility Employee) and measure some distances involved in this extension. Bob stated that we are looking at a distance of approximately 3200 to 3400 feet of line with a very good chance of hitting rock. Approximate cost could reach \$10,000.⁰⁰ to \$11,000.⁰⁰ The Board told Mr. Smith that the

Water utility could not extend the line at the utility's expense as they have followed this practice for the past 10 years. The Board suggested that Mr. Bush and Mr. Smith get together with all parties interested in getting water service and report back to this Board.

Bob Jozzigg gave the Board a letter which he has written to be approved and signed by the Board to be sent to Mr & Mrs. Pitchford in an attempt to discuss future possibilities of building a water reservoir on their property. The letter was signed and is to be mailed to Mr & Mrs. Pitchford.

Mr. Jozzigg also stated he has been studying the possibility of raising our existing dam which could possibly raise our lake water level 21 feet. Bob was to do an on site study and report on this at the July meeting.

Bary Betrost reported to the Board that Larry Haag with the Indiana Department of Environmental Management was down from Indianapolis last week. A plant inspection was done and a copy given to the Board. There was also discussion concerning Borden Tri-County water quality which is still poor. Mr. Haag is still working on this.

Gary Getrost gave the Board a bid on a booster pump for the purpose of discontinuing the Borden Tri-County connection. Gary is to get an installation cost and land easement and report to Ron Lamb. The cost of the pump arrangement was \$2746.00 which includes a spare pump.

Gary also stated that the Water Utility had purchased 3 used fire hydrants from Jim Baylor at the cost of \$100.00 for all three.

Gary told the Board that due to the great amount of rainfall, the lake is at a very good level. Approximately 6" from overflow stage compared to about 6 feet down from overflow stage last year at this time. He also stated that the Utility has been able to produce more water this year and buy less, approximately 8000,000 gallons less than last year at this time.

Ralph Dodge wants the Board to re-install a street light across the street (Clark St.) from the bulk fill-up. The Board decided against this at this time.
