August 14, 1972

Terry Boaz opened the meeting. All members, Charles Birkla, Farnsley Burkhart, and two visitors were present. The minutes from the last meeting were read and approved; the treasurer's report shows as of July 31, 1972, General Fund \$632.07, MVH \$1,611.25, and CCIF \$2,772.98. All funds total \$5,216.30. Claims were presented and approved for payment.

Ronald Kennedy DMD, who has an office in Floyds Knobs, was invited to give his views on fluoridation of water. He stated he was very much in favor of fluoridation. In his practice in this area of unfluoridated water, he sees much tooth decay in young children. In the Louisville Dental School an area of fluoridated water, he saw less tooth decay in young children. Older persons will not receive much benefit from fluoride in the water, but children growing up with a fluoridated water supply will have a tooth structure less prone to decay.

Donald Uhl moved and Robert Gibson seconded that the Greenville Water Utility start adding fluoride to the water supply with the approval and direction of the State Board of Health.

Donna Krieger talked of parking problems around her residence. The board is working on a general parking ordinance for the town which will remedy several problems. The present ordinance will be enforced only during normal store hours.

Donald Uhl is to contact someone to haul sand from Ohio for the filters at the treatment plant.

The County Board of Health officer with Charles Birkla toured the bad sanitation areas of the town. Recommendations were made and property owners must abide.




