

## **Minutes of Greenville Town Council Meeting June 12<sup>th</sup>, 2017**

Vice President Andy Lemon called the regular monthly meeting to order. Other Councilpersons present were, Keith Johnson, David Gomes, and Darryl Kepley along with Clerk Jack Travillian. Also attending the meeting were Water Superintendent Steven Schmitt, and several concerned citizens. The meeting was opened with a prayer from Citizen J. Tush followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

**Minutes:** The amended minutes for May 8<sup>th</sup> regular meeting were discussed. Motion was made by Councilman Johnson and seconded by Councilman Kepley to accept the amended minutes. Motion passed 4-0.

**Marshal Report:**

Marshal Craig requested reimbursement for window tinting. The council voted 4-0 to reimburse the Marshal from the General Maintenance Fund.

**Financial:**

Review/Approval Checks and Expenditures: Clerk Travillian presented the forms for the checks written from the utilities and the town. The checks were approved without objections.

**2017-TR-018 Transfer of Funds:** The council requested transfer of funds for the marshal's department. Transferring \$2,000 from Motor Vehicle Fund – Snow Removal transfer to General Fund Marshal's Fuel, motion made by Councilman Johnson seconded by Councilman Lemon. Motion passed 4-0. Transferring \$1,000 from Motor Vehicle Fund – Snow Removal to Motor Vehicle Fund – Telephone Account. Motion was made by Councilman Lemon and seconded by Councilman Johnson. Motion passed 4-0.

**Old Business:**

Councilman Gomes is continuing discussion for fire protection contract with the Greenville Township Volunteer Fire Department.

**Committee Reports:**

**Streets and Roads:**

Councilman Kepley presented bids for road repairs. 1<sup>st</sup> bid was for \$700 from Wright Construction for Parkland Height blacktop curb. Motion made by Councilman Lemon and seconded by Councilman Johnson. Motion passed 4-0. 2<sup>nd</sup> bid for drainage on Clark Street for \$4,200. Councilman Kepley will contact the home owner about covering their portion of the proposal. 3<sup>rd</sup> bid for \$150 to clear brush and trees from road-right-away along Sprigler Drive and Clark Street. Motion was made by Councilman Johnson and seconded by Councilman Kepley. Motion passed 4-0. Pekin Road drainage issue will wait on surveying being done in July.

The current projects along Harrison Street to be completed next week and Voyles Road by mid-September being done by Floyd County Road Department.

**Utility Business:**

Superintendent Schmitt gave the monthly adjustment report. The council accepted the adjustments without comment.

Superintendent Schmitt reported on 6 inch main line break along Highway 150 at Twin Bridges was repaired at a cost of \$3,720. There was also leaks on Clark Street and in Clover Creek. The estimate for having the 6" main replace along Highway 150 were between \$60,000 from Christianti to \$64,956 from Day Star plus the hook up cost of between \$5,000 - \$10,000.

**New Truck:**

Bids for the replacement truck from Ford – F150 \$25,391.64, Toyota - \$29,439.79 and Chevy Colorado - \$26,000. The council will wait for all councilmembers being present before deciding.

Superintendent Schmitt proposed purchasing a new utility bed to replace the current bed on the Chevy Silverado to make it more useful in day to day operation, pre-loading equipment for repairs. Cost is \$5,750. Motion was made by Councilman Lemon and seconded by Councilman Johnson. Motion passed 4-0.

The water testing results survey was mailed to all current customer.

**Sewage Plant:**

Superintendent Schmitt requested both the new full time and part time hires to get the hepatitis shots that are required to work on sewage equipment estimated cost \$720, the shots are given in three stages. Motion made by Councilman Johnson and seconded by Councilman Lemon. Motion passed 4-0.

There was a complaint from a citizen about a neighbor having chickens, Vice President Lemon requested a formal written response.

No further business coming before the Council, motion made by Councilman Johnson and seconded by Councilman Lemon, passed 4-0, the meeting was adjourned.
